**ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT
FOR THE YEAR, 2019-20 (as on 31st March 2020)**

Industries Department, Manipur was established in the year 1953 and Shri H. Birahari Singh ex -Manipur State Darbar Member was the Director.

Under the policy of de-centralization of powers of the Union Government, six (6) District Industry Centres came into existence in the State of Manipur with effect from 1st May, 1978. Subsequently, Directorate of Commerce & Industries, Manipur has been bifurcated into two Directorates, namely Directorate of Trade, Commerce & Industries and Directorate of Handlooms & Textiles with effect from 2nd January, 2017.

The Director of Trade, Commerce & Industries, Manipur is assisted by 287 employees comprising of 19 Grade I, 42 Grade II, 143 Grade III and 83 Grade IV employees. During the year under report, Shri C. Arthur Worchuiyo, IAS is the Director of Trade, Commerce & Industries, Manipur.

The activities of the Directorate may be broadly categorized under seven groups as follows:

I Village & Small Enterprises

- (1) Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME)
- (2) Food Processing Industries
- (3) Trade & Commerce
- (4) Administration of the Factories Act, 1948 and the Indian Boilers Act, 1923 and the rules made there under.
- (5) Registration of Partnership Firms under Indian Partnership Act, 1932,

II Industries Other Than Village & Small Enterprise

III Mineral Development

The organizational set-up of the Department consists of various Divisions/Sections namely : (1) Establishment, (2) Planning, Evaluation & Co-ordination, (3) Budget & Expenditure, (4) Accounts, (5) General Administration, (6) Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise (MSME) (7) Policies, (8) Training Centres, (9) EDP, (10) DIC Monitoring Cell, (11) Khadi & Village Industries (12) Food Processing Industries, (13) IT & Computerization, (14) Trade & Commerce, (15) Investment, (16) Factory & Boilers, (17) Partnership Registration, (18) Nucleus Cell (19) Large & Medium, (20) Geology & Mining, etc. In the Districts: there are 16 (sixteen) DICs, one in each of the District.

The developmental expenditure for the year under report as on **31st March, 2020** was **Rs. 666.53 lakh as against** the revised outlay of **Rs. 1203.42 lakh** while the committed expenditure was **Rs. 1804.04 lakh** against the revised outlay of **Rs. 3143.24 lakh**.

I. VILLAGE & SMALL ENTERPRISES

(1) Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) Sector

(i) Setting up of Industrial Estates:

The Directorate of Trade, Commerce & Industries, Manipur is committed to set up industrial estates in each of the 16 (sixteen) districts of Manipur with the financial assistance of the Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises and the NEC. The Ministry of MSME, Government of India provides fund for development of infrastructure such as land development, power supply, roads, fencing etc. whereas NEC provides fund for construction of work sheds. At present, Industrial Estates have been established in three districts of Imphal West at Takyelpat, Bishnupur at Tera Urak and Thoubal at Kuraopokpi. Another three Industrial Estates are under construction in the districts of Chandel, Ukhrul and Churachandpur. Further, the required lands have been acquired for construction of Industrial Estates in Imphal East, Senapati, and Tamenglong districts. Funding pattern in respect of MSME and that of State Government is 80:20 while that of NEC is 90:10.

(a) Industrial Estate at T. M. Kasom in Ukhrul District:

Construction of Industrial Estate of Ukhrul District at T. M. Kasom was started with the assistance from MSME from the year 2016. An amount of Rs. 759.35 lakh from MSME and NEC share for construction of work shed of Rs.1231.50 lakh has been received.

(b) Upgradation of Takyelpat Industrial Estate, Imphal West

The Takyelpat Industrial Estate was established in the early 1970s and it is the only established industrial estate in Manipur. There are 38 industrial units within the estate and many of the units have gained prominence winning national level and state level awards. In June 2013 the Ministry of MSME, GoI has approved for upgradation of Takyelpat Industrial Estate and its completed on 2019 with total 58 worksheds are functioning till date. Additional works taken up in the Industrial Estate of Takyel, Imphal West district during 2019-20:-

Two number of Type B work sheds were reconstructed in the Takyel Industrial Estate at the cost of Rs. 50.00 lakh each to fill up the gutted sheds.

(c) Setting up of Common Facility Centre under Micro & Small Enterprises- Cluster Development Programme:

Ministry of MSME, Government of India approved three cluster development projects in Manipur namely, Spice and Food Processing Cluster Churachandpur, Wood Carpentry Cluster Churachandpur and Greater Imphal jewellery Cluster Imphal East. The project will be implemented by IIE Gauwahti. State's matching share of Rs. 42.64 lakh for Spice and Food Processing Cluster Churachandpur, Rs. 23.87 lakh for Wooden carpentry Cluster Churachandpur and Rs. 32.90 lakh for Greater Imphal Jewellery Cluster Imphal East were sanctioned during the year 2019-20. (d) Incentives under North East Industrial and Investment Promotion Policy (NEIIPP), 2007:

The North East Industrial and Investment Promotion Policy, 2007 is a Scheme implemented by the Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India to boost setting up industries in North East Region. It gives various incentives like Capital Investment Subsidy, Interest Subsidy, Comprehensive Insurance Subsidy, Transport Subsidy, etc. Subsidy under the Scheme can be availed by any existing as well as new manufacturing and service sector industry. Under the Scheme, a total of 16 industrial units of Manipur have availed incentives for a total amount of Rs. 46.46 crore during 2019-20.

NEIIPP, 2007 has been discontinued and a new scheme called North East development Scheme (NEIDS), 2017 has been introduced by the Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India. Under NEIDS, only new industrial units will be eligible to avail the incentives. Further, to avail the incentives under this scheme, the industrial units are required to register themselves in their web portal. So far, 14 industrial units from Manipur have submitted online applications for registration out of which, registration of one unit has been approved.

(e) Udyag Aadhaar Memorandum (UAM): As part of ‘Ease of Doing Business’, Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Government of India New Delhi launched ‘Udyag Aadhaar Memorandum (UAM) in September 2015. UAM is one page online form and allows ease of registration of MSME units i.e. either “Manufacturing” or “Service”. UAM now replaces the need of filing Entrepreneurs Memorandum.

(f) PMEGP: Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) :

Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) is a credit linked subsidy programme introduced by the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Govt. of India by merging two earlier schemes namely, Prime Minister Rojgar Yojana (PMRY) and Rural Employment Generation Programme (REGP) *for generation of employment opportunities* through establishment of micro enterprises. The Scheme is implemented by the Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC), a statutory organisation under the Ministry of MSME, as the single nodal agency at the National Level. At the State Level, it is implemented through State KVICs, State KVIBs and DICs. The Govt. subsidy under the Scheme is routed by KVIC through the identified banks.

Objective:

- (a) To create employment opportunities through self-employment ventures.
- (b) To help arrest migration of rural youth to urban or other places by giving them self-employment opportunities; and
- (c) To increase wage earning capacities of artisans and contribute to increase in growth rate.

For implementation of PMEGP during 2019-20, the Khadi and Village Industries Commission allocated a physical target of 2400 No. and margin money (subsidy) of Rs. 2872.14 lakh with an aim to generate employment of 9192 Nos. in the Manipur. The state was able to attain 77.57% financial achievement during the year. Agency-wise achievement during 2019-20 is as under:

(g) Departmental Training Centre: The main objective of the scheme is to impart trainings to aspiring entrepreneurs to enable them to take up self-employment ventures or make them self employed in industrial units. There are 9 (nine) Training Centre. 8(eight) Cluster Type Training Centres (CTTC) at Porompat, Jiribam, Moirang, Churachandpur, Chandel, Tadubi, Ukhrul and Tamenglong and one Arts & Crafts Training Centre (ACTC) at Thoubal.

Courses Offered :

(i) **One year Advance course** in Tailoring & Cutting, Carpentry, Weaving at Porompat, Thoubal, Churachandpur. Only One year Advance course in weaving is at Ukhrul.

(ii) **One year Elementary Course** in the trade of Tailoring & Cutting, Carpentry, weaving are at Porompat, Thoubal, Churachandpur, Chandel, Ukhrul, Tadubi and Tamenglong. Cane and Bamboo is at Porompat, Thoubal, Churachandpur and Moirang. Jiribam training centre is conducting one year Weaving course only. One year course on carpet weaving and Foundry are at CTTC Porompat and Thoubal. Doll & Toys and Blacksmithy are at CTTC Porompat.

(iii) **Six month Short Term Course** in Wool Knitting is running at CTTC Porompat, Churachandpur & Ukhrul. Embroidery is at Porompat only.

A total of 229 trainees passed out in Advance course, Elementary Course and Short term courses training in the trade of Tailoring & Cutting, Carpentry, Cane and Bamboo, Black smithy, Doll and Toys, Foundry, Weaving, Wool-knitting and Embroidery for the year 2019-20.

(h) **SC/ST Hub Scheme**

The National Scheduled Caste Scheduled Tribe Hub (NCST) was launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 18 October, 2016 throughout the country with an objective to provide professional support to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe entrepreneurs to fulfill the obligations under the Public Procurement Policy Order 2012 of the Central Government, adopt applicable business practices and leverage the Stand Up India initiative. Accordingly, under this scheme an amount of Rs.100.00 lakh has been received from the Ministry of MSME and released to the Implementing Agency, MANIDCO, to take up all possible training etc. Accordingly, MANIDCO imparted awareness programs. During the year 2019-20, Awareness Programms, Skill Development Programms were taken up and sponsored SC-ST entrepreneurs in the **North East Summit** at Maniram Dewan Trade Centre, Guwahati, Assam during the month of November, 2019.

(2) FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES:

Food Processing Industry Sector is a fast growing Industry. It plays a vital role in the development of industries and creates large employment generation in the State. Some of the activities taken up by the Directorate are as under :-

(a) **EDP on Food Processing:** 4-Weeks Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP) on Food Processing consisting of 30 entrepreneurs was conducted at Food Processing Training Centre, Porompat, Imphal East. Such programme were conducted two times during the year. A total of 60 entrepreneurs/trainees received the training and an amount of Rs. 9.00/- lakh was expended for the programme.

(b) **Pradhan Mantri Kisan Sampada Yojana (PMKSY):** Under the Scheme of Pradhan Mantri Kisan Sampada Yojana (PMKSY), the Department of Textiles, Commerce & Industry has initiated actions for implementation of the following scheme:

Mega Food Park: Considering the need to develop Agro-Food Processing sectors, a project on Mega Food Park is being established at Yaithibi Khunou, Kakching District. The Ministry of Food Processing Industry, Govt. of India has accorded in principle approval with a project cost of Rs. 8182.60 lakh.

(c) **Food Park at Nilakuthi :** It was established by the Department of Textiles, Commerce & Industries, Government of Manipur under the funding of the Ministry of Food Processing Industries, Government of India and managed by Manipur Food Industries Corporation Ltd. The Park covers an area of 31 acres (approx) at Nilakuthi, Imphal East. There are 49 plots having 600 sq.m each. 6 number of plots have been allocated to MSME for establishment of Technology Centre and another 43 plots were allotted to various entrepreneurs of Food Processing Units.

(3) Trade & Commerce

(a) Participation in the India International Trade Fair, 2019 :

To promote exposure and to extend assistance to entrepreneurs of the State, to attract buyers and sellers, 6 (six) number of selected persons took part in the IITF, 2019 held at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi from 14th November to 27th November 2019 under the sponsorship of the Department of Trade, Commerce & Industries, Manipur. On the 3rd day of the fair, Manipur State Day was celebrated presenting 6 items of cultural dance.

(b) Manipur Sangai Festival, 2019:

Department of Trade, Commerce & Industries, Manipur took a major role in stall construction and arrangement for allotment of stalls to the participants at two venues viz : (1) Hapta Kangjeibung and (2) Manipur Trade and Expo Centre, Lamboikhongnangkhang. Forty four stalls were occupied by Foreign Countries and seventy stalls occupied by participants from outside the State and the rest were occupied by local entrepreneurs.

(c) Construction of Manipur Trade and Expo Centre: The Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India approved, a DPR at the cost of Rs. 15.86 crore for establishment of Main Exhibition Building (Phase II) at the Manipur Trade and Expo Centre, Lamboikhongnangkhang in Imphal West District under the Scheme of Trade, Infrastructure for Export Scheme (TIES). Funding pattern of the project is given below:

MANIDCO, the implementing Agency, received fund amounting to Rs. 5.63 crore during the year 2018-19 and completed the following works:

- (a) Concrete and RCC work of the first floor
- (b) Form Work
- (c) Tubular Trusses and Roofing for atrium & cut out area of slab
- (d) Plinth Protection



During the year 2019-20, the State Government sanctioned an amount of Rs. 317.00 lakh as state matching share and deposited to the implementing agency, MANIDCO.

(4) Factory Sector:

The Director of Trade, Commerce & Industries, Manipur is the ex-officio Chief Inspector of Factories and Boilers.

A manufacturing unit is determined a Factory under the provisions contained in the Factories Act, 1948.

As many as **31** numbers of permits and 22 numbers of licences for setting up of factories were granted by Department of Trade, Commerce & Industries to applicant units under the Factories Act, 1948. A sum of **Rs 8.85 lakh** was collected as revenue and Rs. **41,500/-** as professional tax by the Department.

(5) Partnership Registration:

The Director of Trade, Commerce & Industries, Manipur is the ex-officio Registrar of Firms.

In Manipur partnership is one of the most practiced form of business organization. Any dispute arising out of the partner venture is bound by the agreement deed signed under Indian partnership Act, 1932.

A total number of **96** Partnership firms were registered under Indian Partnership Act, 1932 and a total amount of Rs **26,436/-** was collected as Revenue by the Department during the year 2019-20.

II. INDUSTRIES OTHER THAN VILLAGE AND SMALL ENTERPRISE

(a) Manipur Industrial Development Corporation Limited (MANIDCO)

Manipur Industrial Development Corporation Limited (MANIDCO), formerly Manipur Small Industries Corporation Limited (MSIC), was incorporated in the year 1969 under the Companies Act, 1956 (No. 1 of 1956). The present authorized Share Capital of the Company is Rs. 7,93,34,000 crore. IDBI's Share is Rs. 4.21 crore. The Corporation is multi-functional company which acts as (i) State Financial Corporation (SFC), (ii) State Industrial Development Corporation (SIDC) and (iii) State Infrastructure Development Corporation (SIDC). It is the only financial institute of the State. The Company has to cater long term credit requirement of the industry. MANIDCO is governed by a Board of Directors. All the members of the Board are representatives of the State Government and Industrial Development Bank of India (IDBI) and Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI). It is worthwhile to mention that there was hardly fund available in the Corporation for industrial activities till the middle of 1980. In order to clear the

backlog in industrialization, the State Government took initiative to revive the activities of MANIDCO with a very low budgetary support till 1985-86. Industrial Development Bank of India (IDBI) also extended active support in this regard. The main activities of the Corporation are:-

(i) State Financial Corporation (SFC): As a State Financial Corporation, MANIDCO started its Term Loan Lending Activities from the year 1986-87 to 1992-93, providing financial assistance to Tiny & Cottage, Small Scale Industries, Hotel Industries and Transport Industries etc. in the State of Manipur under the Refinance Scheme of Industrial Development Bank of India (IDBI) and Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI).

(ii) State Industrial Development Corporation (SIDC):

As a State Industrial Development Corporation, MANIDCO participated investment to subsidiary/ joint sector projects (industrial units) with the insistence of the State Government.

(iii) State Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (SIIDC)/Engineering Cell:

As State Industrial Infrastructure Development Cell, MANIDCO has been undertaking Construction and Design Services for various civil construction works in the State of Manipur. Some of the works are funded externally/ centrally and some are State sponsored projects. The present Projects/works taken up by the Engineering Cell are as under:

- (i) Externally funded projects: Manipur Sericulture Project, Sanghaipat, Wangbal and Khurkhul.
- (ii) Centrally funded projects: ASIDE Projects of Department of Commerce, Govt. of India at Moreh and Lamboikhongnangkong, 100 bedded Hospital at Ukhrul of DoNER, Industrial Estates under MSME & NEC, and Sport Infrastructure at Takyelpat under SAI & AAI.
- (iii) State funded; Dept. of Tourism, Dept. of Sericulture, Dept. of Com. & Ind., Dept. of Health & Services, Dept. of Sports and Youth Affairs and Finance Department, Govt. of Manipur.

The Engineering Cell has been functioning with great reputation. Credibility and accountability in implementation of the projects are the main attractive criteria of the Corporation. MANIDCO is sustaining from the agency charges from the deposit works for the last 15 years.

(b) Manipur Electronics Development Corporation Limited (MANITRON):

Manipur Electronics Development Corporation Limited (MANITRON) was incorporated on 1st July, 1987 with authorized Share Capital of Rs. 300.00 lakh. The total paid up Share Capital is 274.00 lakh only as on date.

The main activity of the Company is the Sale and Servicing of electronics and I.T. related equipments of the Government Departments, Undertaking etc. The other present turn key activities are:

- (i) Printing & issuance of Smart Card, Driving Licence and Registration Certificate of vehicles under Transport, Govt. of Manipur.
- (ii) Biometric Enrolment of Aadhaar and
- (iii) Data Entry for Aadhaar Seeding with NPR.

III. MINERAL DEVELOPMENT:

Main functions of the Geology & Mining Division are (a) Mineral Exploration and (b) Mineral Administration. Mineral exploration is taken up by Geology & Mining Division regularly under the State Plan fund.

Financial Aspects:

- Budget Provision (RE) : Rs.13.30 lakh
- Expenditure : Rs. 0.75 Lakh
- Revenue collected : Rs. 8.56 lakh

A. Holding of State Geological Programming Board (SGPB):

The 15th meeting of the State Geological Programming Board, (SGPB), Manipur was held on 5th February, 2020 under the chairmanship of the Addl. Chief Secretary (T,C&I) to review the works done during the Field Seasons 2018-19 and 2019-20 and approval of the Annual Geological Programme,2020-21 of Geology & Mining Division. The Geological Survey of India, Camp Office Imphal also made a presentation of their works carried out during 2019-20.

B. MINERAL EXPLORATION:

In view of limited fund earmarked for Mineral Exploration, only one programme viz. Drilling of Shingda Limestone Deposit was proposed during 2019-20. However, it also not taken up due to non-encashment of required fund.

C. MINERAL ADMINISTRATION:

(a) Grant of Quarrying Lease: During 2019-20 a total of 58(fifty eight) applications for Grant of Quarrying Lease had been received, out of which 48 applications had been processed as per rules. Amongst these, 7(seven) applications have fulfilled all terms and conditions for the grant of quarrying leases.

(b) Execution of Quarrying Lease Deed: 7(seven) Quarrying Lease Deed were executed with 4 (four) individuals for mining of minor minerals on 11/12/2019 and 13/12/2019. Revenue collected from minor minerals during 2019-20 is Rs. 8.56 lakh.

(c) Grant of Mining Lease of major minerals: State Level Committee constituted to consider grant of Mining Lease for major minerals held its meeting on 27/4/2019. The Committee examined the Exploration Report submitted by M/s Facor Alloys Ltd., Bhubaneswar for grant of ML for chromite at an area of 8.75 sq.km at Lunghar, Sihai Khullen and Nungbi area of Ukhul District but found to lack some specific data. Therefore, the Company was advised to re-submit the proposal after completion of the basic requirement as per the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 and rules framed there under.

(d) Reservation of areas for State Government Undertaking: The State Government had submitted to the Ministry of Mines, Govt. of India on status of Reconnaissance Permit(RP), Prospecting Licence (PL) and Mining Lease (ML) in the prescribed format providing by the Indian Bureau of Mines for reservation of 10 (ten) areas of chromite and 8 (eight) areas of limestone for undertaking exploration and mining by Manipur Industrial Corporation Ltd. (MANIDCO) with private companies in the State under Section 17 A (2) of MMDR.
